



Amended By-Laws

The Association amended its By-Laws, As In Force 27 January 2023 at the General Committee Meeting held on 27 January 2023.

Apart from the usual minor changes, due to amended/upgraded procedures, changes to operation within NTG Acts, there were three new sections included. These were:

- Patron
- Life Membership
- Service Awards

The Association felt that as we have continued to grow, continue to provide additional services for our seniors, that the inclusion of these components complements our present-day operations.

Patron

The Association can now appoint a Patron, a person who can assist adding value to our organisation and maybe either a passive or active Patron.

We have approved a Role Description and processes for the appointment of a Patron as well as appointed a Patron Appointment Team (PAT) consisting of the President, Vice President and 2 other Committee members and outlined the operational capacity to action this task.

Life Member

The Association has some outstanding Approved Volunteers who have been integral components of the PLSA Committees over many years, as well as providing consistent service supporting our seniors – without our Approved Volunteers, the Association would not exist, remembering we have no paid staff and are totally run by Approved Volunteers who dedicate some serious hours to the job. We also have other Approved Volunteer Members who also have provided consistent service to the Association (other than on the Committees) and its members for a number of years. The Life Member, among other things should have provided exceptional ongoing service for more than a minimum of 7 years, among other criteria.

In order to appoint a Life Member, the Association has appointed a Life Member Appointment Team (LMAT) consisting of the President, Vice President and one other Committee Member.

The Association has also approved a Life Member Application Form to aid this process.

Service Awards

As mentioned, there are several Committee Members (past and present) as well as other Approved Volunteers within the Association who have provided the Association with continuous service for many years which have gone largely unrecognised.

To this end; the Association has now approved a three-tier award structure for recognition. These awards being:

- 5 years of service
- 10 years of service
- 15 years of service

The commencement of the service awards has been deemed to have commenced from the 24 November 2014, the date the Association became incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act, beyond that the present-day Association has no formal reliable records.

The Association has commenced a database from the above forementioned date and is looking to recognising eligible people during 2023.

All eligible people will be recognised at a presentation later in 2023. They will be awarded an Acrylic Ballast representing the relevant years' service as well as presented with a framed certificate.
