Well,. - did you know that we have 250

financial members! Of these; 198 members registered for at least one event during Seniors Fortnight – 79.2% of members! This is really encouraging and is at an all-time high!

The Association made available 1,182 event places this year for Seniors Fortnight and 1,160 event places were utilized.

The policy of the PLSA has always been that we do not charge Seniors for events during Seniors Fortnight and 2023 was no exception.

In order for this to happen lots of sponsorship and fundraising need to take place throughout the year by Committee and Endorsed Volunteers – lots of hard work done by colleagues – Seniors!

However; we do charge members who register for Seniors Fortnight a Registration Fee -\$10.00/person and that reason has been again reinforced unfortunately this year.

Many of our events are required to be pre-paid and have waiting lists during Seniors Fortnight (some waiting lists had Over 30 names on them), which we try very hard to manage to allow as many people as possible to attend events. **BUT** there has been a disturbing number of people who register, do not attend **AND** do not advise the Association they are not coming.

Particularly where there are waiting lists; this has two flow-on effects.

- 1) We pay funds for people who do not attend (no refunds possible)
- 2) Waiting List members are denied a place at the event due to selfishness of other!

Would you be surprised to know there were 29 NO SHOWS this year. There were also 22 people, who on the day were sick, needed to attend Hospital appointments (advised by the Hospital on short notice usually) etc who did advise us, but in some cases, mainly sickness where not able to advise us sooner, thus we were not able to replace them on the event. The NO SHOWS cost the Association \$981.00 this year – there is no excuse for this loss except selfishness!

Sickness cost the Association \$501.00 this year – this is unfortunate and cannot be helped.

Some people even pulled out at the last minute, citing excuses like "we're going to another event now"!

The motto of the story is – if you are not intending to attend the event ring the Association on 0455 660 026 and cancel so others might be able to be moved from the Waiting Lists!

On a brighter note, the fee structure for new and renewal of membership continues to be:

1st September to 31st December – Free!

In order to register for the Seniors Christmas Lunch, you needed to be a financial member by the 01st September 2023.

As we are all aware; rising costs continue to plague us all, including the PLSA. Our insurance and suppliers of events – and yes, we have good sponsors assisting us all. However, the PLSA at its recent meeting has approved a rise for the Association Membership Fee, effective 01 January 2024 to \$30.00/person.

Previously the figure of \$20.00/person has been in place for four years without change and we have managed to contain costs.

The registration fee of \$10.00/person for Registration at Seniors Fortnight will remain unchanged at \$10.00/person for another year.

This change has not been taken lightly, we understand the cost-of-living pressures, however, in order to continue providing you with the quality events we have all become accustomed to, this change is necessary.

'A Place for People'

It's that time of year again, where Council Rate notices are sent out to ratepayers. This year is proving to be a particularly difficult year for many people, so I thought that it would be a timely opportunity to remind everyone that council can help if the cost of living is getting a bit much.

Every council, not just Palmerston, is required to have a Rates Concession and Financial Hardship Policy. However, you don't have to feel as through you are in financial hardship to approach council for a confidential discussion with our rates officers on making it easier to pay your rates. For example, you can request that Council waivers interest and you enter a fortnightly or monthly payment plan, if the 4 instalments are hard to meet. The instalments can be of an amount that suits your situation, so that you don't feel stressed or under pressure. All we ask is that you contact council as soon as possible to discuss the options that are available to you.

The Pre-Cyclone Cleanup is also upon us! Unfortunately, at the time of reading this we will be about halfway through the Pre-Cyclone Cleanup. However, if you are in Gray, Gunn, Durack, Johnston, Zuccoli or Farrar, there is still time for you to put your items on the verge for collection. Seniors can also request assistance to move items onto the verge. Please call 8935 9922 a week prior to you collection date. Information about what you can put on the verge can be found on Council's website or by calling our Customer Service team.

Lastly, the final Flicnics for the dry season is on 23 September at Sanctuary Lakes, at 7pm. The movie is A Man Called Otto (rated M). Bring a picnic or purchase from the food vans, bring a blanket or chairs and watch a movie under the stars!
