Membership 2024

There are some important changes that have been made regarding membership criteria in 2024.

- 1) As in other years, Membership contribution falls due on the 01st of January of each year – no change.
- Membership contribution for 2024 is \$30.00. 2)
- 3) If you have a Carer who brings you to events and stays with you, even once, they MUST also be a financial member of the Association.

Their membership contribution can either be paid by the Carer or yourself. It will also be \$30.00 *.

* Note: - this change is due to insurance coverage -Public Liability and not the making of the PLSA.

To register for Seniors Fortnight, you must be a 4) financial member by 30 April 2024.

- 5) To register for the Seniors Christmas Lunch, you must be a financial member by 01 September 2024, no exceptions.



Animal Management By-Laws

Our long-awaited Animal Management By-laws are almost ready for adoption in July. Changes will include more provisions for declaring dangerous dogs, higher penalties for dog attacks and reporting for nuisance animals will include cats, poultry, and other animals, not just dogs. Microchipping will also be compulsory for both cats and dogs to ensure that animals can be returned to their owners. The Council also offers cheap desexing and microchipping to Palmerston residents. This popular program booked out in less than a day so keep a look out for the next round to register your interest.

Boundary Redistribution

On the 15th of December 2023 an independent review into electorate boundaries was completed and some changes may impact you. Anyone impacted by the new boundaries will vote in their new electorate at the August election. Below is a table of the Palmerston and Rural suburbs and the electorate they will belong to this election.

Electorate (as at August 2024)	Suburb
Spillett	Durack, Durack Heights, Farrar Johnston, Yarrawonga and the northern section of Zuccoli
Brennan	Bakewell, Rosebery, Mitchell and southern section of Zuccoli
Drysdale	Gunn, Gray, Driver
Blain	Bellamack, Moulden, Woodroffe, Archer
Nelson	Marlow Lagoon, Howard Springs, McMinns Lagoon, Coolalinga, Girraween, Herbert, Pinelands and a small section of Humpty Doo
Goyder	No changes – retains all the current suburbs

First up, you need to register for the card (if you need a hand, feel free to call into our office and we can assist you). To, activate this card you require a PIN, and always select 'credit' when making purchases.

If you're not keen on navigating the digital age, you have the option to nominate a trusted individual, be it a family member or friend, to manage the card on your behalf.

The card is accepted nearly everywhere, albeit with a few exceptions.

While you can't withdraw cash directly for this card it is incredibly versatile for most transactions where Visa is accepted.
